SECONDARY SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The following scholarships are only available to Maori students at secondary school and are administered by the Maori Education Trust.

Maori and Polynesian Secondary School (Course) Scholarships

For Maori and Polynesian students attending any State school or registered private secondary school. Payment is only available where there is no secondary school the student can reasonably be expected to attend which provides a course of instruction appropriate to the student's need while the student lives at home. The scholarship is renewable. Closing date: 7 December 1999, Value: \$1990, Number: Variable

Maori and Polynesian Secondary School (Distance) Scholarship

For Maori or Polynesian students attending a State or registered private school, where there is no secondary school the student can be reasonably expected to attend, because of distance. This scholarship is renewable provided the student's home address does not change. 70 scholarships of \$1990 per year. Closing date 7 December 1999.

Maori and Polynesian Special Needs Scholarship

Available to students who are physically or emotionally at risk in their current environment and must move to another area for schooling.
